

### **Bring Peace to Armed Conflict**

- Learn nonviolent methods to protect civilians in violent conflict
- Learn how to work with local communities to deter violence

#### What is Unarmed Civilian Protection?

- Unarmed civilian protection (UCP) is a methodology for the direct protection of civilians, for violence reduction, and for supporting local peace infrastructures. UCP provides unarmed, specially trained civilians who live and work with local civil society in areas of violent conflict.
- Unarmed civilian protection is an emerging discipline, currently practiced in areas of conflict such as Colombia, South Sudan, Palestine, the United States, Iraq, and the Mindanao region of the Philippines.
- Always nonviolent and nonpartisan, unarmed civilian protectors support local actors as
  they work to address the roots and consequences of violent conflict. This practice is
  grounded in international law, in the principle of civilian immunity in war, and in the
  protection afforded by international conventions. This course aims to contribute to the
  common objectives of protecting civilians and keeping peace.

#### Why the Urgency?

- More civilians are displaced by violent conflict for longer periods than any time since World War II—and the number is growing.
- Be a part of the solution: Learn field-tested, effective methods to protect civilians and prevent violence.
- The High-Level Independent Panel on United Nations Peace Operations (HIPPO) asserted that "Unarmed strategies must be at the forefront of UN efforts to protect civilians."

#### Why Take the Course?

- describe the key principles, objectives, and sources of guidance for UCP;
- analyze a conflict and identify vulnerable populations;
- demonstrate an understanding of the methods of UCP and how they can be adapted and applied to a conflict situation;
- identify key features of an effective UCP implementation plan and exit strategy, with a view toward maximizing the security both of UCP staff and local civilians
